Select Who Am I? from the left hand navigation menu on your dashboard. Complete all the surveys if not already done. You can also redo surveys based on new information about yourself. 2. Find your Occupation Matches. To do this, click Match Results, and scroll down to view which Occupations you have been matched with based on your answers to the first five surveys. You can filter by Education Level and Career Cluster to help you find what interests you. Click Load More to see more results. 3. Complete Compatibility surveys for at least three Occupation Matches and review your results. Favourite and add attractive opportunities to your Portfolio (Note: a red heart on the icon indicates if the opportunity has been favoured). 4. Select your most attractive option, and click on the Occupation name to be taken to the Occupation Planner. Select the Requirements tab to view the requirements for this job. What level of education does this opportunity require? 5. Go to your Career Portfolio and find the box with your most attractive Occupation option. Write a brief reflection (How am I going to pursue this opportunity? How can I research this opportunity further? What steps do I need to take?). <p><i>NOTE: The Learning Styles, Personality, Interests, Knowledge and Motivations assessments must be completed before a student can complete the Compatibility surveys.</i></p>	<p>Extension:</p> <p>Review your selected Post-Secondary and Occupation options in your Career Portfolio and eliminate two opportunities. Following this, have them add a Journal Entry to their Career Portfolio and reflect on the reasons why they eliminated those opportunities.</p>

<p>Learning Goal: ✓ to learn more about your interests and passions with the added context of having completed all the Career Spectrum assessments</p>	<p>ACTIVITY: Create 2 Custom Boxes In Portfolio</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select Portfolios from the top tabs on your dashboard. 2. Add a new Portfolio, give it a name (i.e. About Me or Career Portfolio), and a description. 3. Add a media box and upload a picture or video of something that best describes who you are / what is your passion / what are you proud of / who do you admire? 4. Add a title and a description. 5. Add a reflection to the box added (Why did you choose to share this? Why is it important to you?). 	<p>Extension: Share your portfolio with a classmate, friend, or family member. Explain why you chose this information. Ask them what boxes they would add to represent themselves.</p>
<p>Learning Goal: ✓ to learn more about creating SMART goals and action plans</p>	<p>ACTIVITY: Goal Setting</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select Goals from the left hand navigation menu on your dashboard and Add Goal. 2. Add ONE (1) Academic Goal (short term) and create an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it. This can be around Learning Skills or to improve on a specific subject area. 3. Add this Academic Goal to your Portfolio (e.g., Career Portfolio, About Me Portfolio). 4. Add ONE (1) Post-Secondary Goal (medium term) and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it. This can apply to a Post-Secondary opportunity that interests you. 5. Add this goal to your Portfolio. 6. Add ONE (1) other goal (long term) and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve them. This can be related to finding a summer job or anything else you would like to improve on. 7. Add this goal to your Portfolio. 8. In your Portfolio write a brief reflection about why you've set these goals (What are you trying to achieve? Why? How does it fit in a bigger plan?). 	<p>Extension: Reflect on past goals and your action plan to complete them. Note any changes you had to make, why you made those changes and the process to completion.</p>

Select Post-Secondary from the left hand navigation menu on your dashboard. 2. Select Apprenticeships, College/University or Workplace. 3. Find three opportunities from one or more pathways that interest you and click the heart icon beside the program title to add it to your list of Favourites. Use the Smart Filters to help narrow your results. 4. In the navigation menu, select FAVOURITES to review your selected program opportunities (click on the Programs tab). Click the three grey dots to the right of the opportunities you favourited today, select the Compare button, and then click the blue Compare button at the top of the screen to view the opportunities side by side. 5. Consider and compare the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Tuition b. Program Length c. Admission Requirements d. Location e. Related Occupations 6. Rank your top three Post-Secondary opportunities by clicking and dragging them into the first, second, and third place spot. 7. Add your recently-favourited opportunities to your portfolio (e.g., Career Portfolio or About Me Portfolio) by clicking on the three grey dots to the right of the opportunity title and selecting the Compare button. 8. Select Portfolios from the menu on your dashboard. 2. Add a custom box to your Portfolio (e.g., Career Portfolio or About Me Portfolio) called “WHO DO I WANT TO BECOME?” and upload a picture or video of something that best describes who you want to become – this is not an occupation, but rather a character strength. 3. Add a title and a description. 4. Write a reflection about why you chose this picture or video. 	<p>Extension:</p> <p>Find and analyse positive messages that are presented by media outlets. Write a journal entry in your Portfolio (e.g., Career or About Me Portfolio) based on your favourite positive message and how you think it impacts young people.</p> <p>(click Add Box, Add Journal). You can also Add Media for this box to represent the message you chose.</p>

Select Occupations in the 'Work' section from the navigation menu on your dashboard. 2. Find an Occupation option by entering an Occupation Name of interest or Keyword in the Search Bar and clicking Search. Too many options? Use the Smart Filters to help narrow your results. 3. Find 2 Occupations that you want to learn more about. Click the three dots to the right of the occupation names, select the Compare button and then click the blue Compare button at the top of the screen to view the Occupations side by side. 4. Consider and compare the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Salary b. Level of education required c. Whether this job is a match for you based on your Who Am I results d. Your Compatibility with this option (to see this you will need to complete the Compatibility Survey) e. Potential Post-Secondary programs (if applicable) 5. Click the star icon below the Occupation Title to favourite attractive options. 6. Repeat steps 2-5 for different Occupation options. Rank your top three choices by selecting FAVOURITES in the navigation menu. Click and drag your top three choices into the slots. 7. Add boxes to your portfolio (e.g., Career or About Me Portfolio) for your recently-favourited occupations by clicking the three dots beside each name, and selecting Add to Portfolio. 9. If you haven't already, add your Contact information; fill in the Education, Volunteer Experience, and Work Experience sections. As well as any Extra Curricular activities. 4. Find a job posting for one of your favourite Occupations. To do this, simply click the Work section in the navigation and select Job Search. Enter the occupation title in the search bar to find real-time job postings from Indeed.ca. You can also search other popular job sites by selecting their name below the search bar! 5. You can also search other popular job sites by selecting their name below the search bar! 3. Once you select your job posting, you will write a Cover Letter in response to this opportunity. Select Cover Letters in the 'Work' section from the navigation menu. From here, complete all the fields: Your Information, Employer Information, Paragraph 1, Paragraph 2, Paragraph 3, and Closing. 4. Click Preview Cover Letter at the bottom right corner of your screen to review formatting options. Select Money from the navigation menu. 2. Select Budget and Finance Guide, and review the information in Budget Basics, Credit and Debit, and Paying for Post-Secondary. Write a paragraph summarizing each section in your own words. 3. Click on your budget and review the budget that is linked to your selected Post-Secondary opportunity. Adjust any income/expenses that need to be updated. 4. Select Portfolios in the 'Home' section from the navigation menu. Select your portfolio (e.g., Career or About Me Portfolio) and Click + Add Box, Add Recent + to add a box containing your Budget. Write a brief reflection concerning your financial progress. Write a reflection about why you wanted to share this experience. 3. Look at your Portfolio (e.g., Career or About Me Portfolio) to review the boxes you've added and ensure each box has a reflection.
